## Schools Lantern Parade Project - Lambing Flat Chinese Festival on March 24

Our school has had an invitation from the organisers of the 2018 Lambing Flat Chinese Festival for the whole school to become involved in the festival this year.

The festival is being held on Saturday March 24 and will be centred in the town's main street, Boorowa Street in the town hall block, which is being closed off to traffic.

The event this year will feature a sunset lantern parade and students have the opportunity to decorate a lantern at school and to bring it along to the festival on Saturday March 24 and take part in the first ever sunset lantern parade to be held in the town of Young and the Hilltops region.

The lanterns are being provided and an artist has been secured to conduct workshops to help students decorate their lanterns. Cost of the lantern, the decorating materials and the artist is all free to the school and its students.

Your child will be able to bring their decorated lantern home after the workshop, and you are being invited to bring your child along to the festival so they can be part of the parade.

The parade will be conducted along Boorowa Street, the popular lion dancers in the lead, and it is expected to start at 7.30pm and be completed within the half hour.

Arrangements are: marshal in Anderson Park at 7.15pm. Children will be given an LED light to put in their lantern to contribute to the overall spectacular illuminated effect. This year the Future Faces music event will be held later in the day, from 5.30pm to 6.30pm, and there will be an Eat Street with many different meal options for families.

The lion and dancers will perform straight after the lantern parade.

The festival program will be launched soon with full details of the day's activities.

These new resources will be warmly welcomed by the students, who can't wait to start using them.

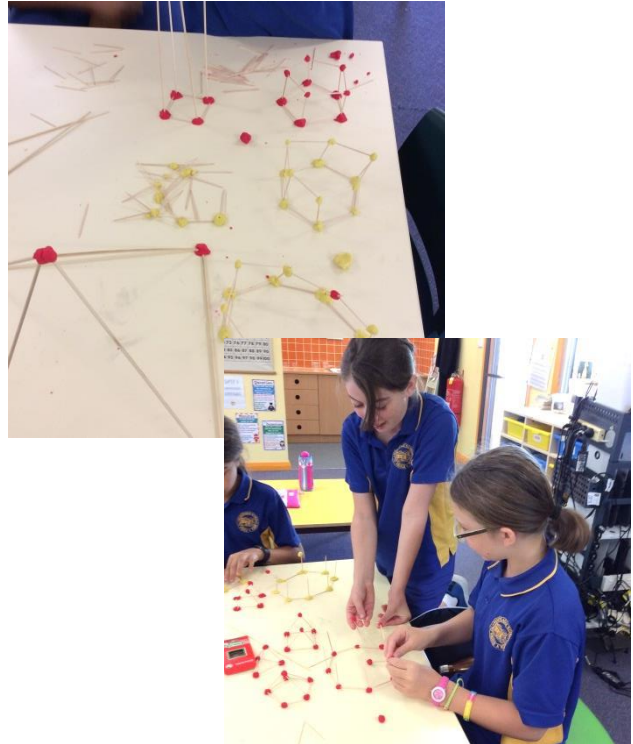
Thank you very much to everybody who collected stickers and supported the school in this promotion.
