When Jacob and Beau from Murrungo Public School, Mrs Gordon and myself got to Borambola we did a dance about drawing. We drew kangaroo's, huts, weapons and tools. We also wrote. We wrote the rules. After that we had lunch which was salad sandwiches. Then we did weaving with Shane and Tahlia and language with Leesha - Ningna means here. Bumaldal means right way. Burr means left. Nungawalla means over there.

Then we went into the cabins for a bit to chill. For dinner we had roast pork with gravy and vegetables. Then we had a wash and brushed our teeth. We watched a movie - I can't remember what it's called but it was funny. Then we went to bed.

The next day we had pancakes for breakfast and raisin toast. We then did weapons and tools and saw some spears that aboriginals used - hunting, death, fish and the spear they used for war with Bob. We then went with Tahlia and Shane again and made hand axes with two rocks and sand stone. THANK YOU. We used the sand stone to sharpen the rocks.

Then we had lunch. We had wraps with different sauces. That's when I ate seven packets of chilli sauce! After that we did art like animal tracks. We then went for a walk, had a group photo and went home. On the way home we stopped at a service station and had something to eat.

Thank you to everybody who has been busy collecting their stickers and placing them into our collection box at Woolworths or bringing them into school.

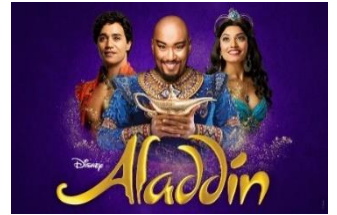
We have received quite a few completed sticker sheets. The more stickers we get, the more resources we get!
